

To mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the following procedures are required by the University.

These procedures are from the Summer of 2021 and will be updated via the University this spring.

Pre-Arrival

- All camp attendees, including campers must provide proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR test (nasal swab or saliva) from a sample taken no earlier than forty-eight (48) hours prior to check-in on campus. The University will not accept antigen tests.
- The University strongly recommends that all camp attendees and User's employees staffing the camp complete a fourteen (14)-day quarantine, including daily symptom monitoring, before arriving on campus.
- Prior to arrival on campus, all minors attending camp must provide contact information for two (2) authorized adults who can arrive on campus within four (4) hours of being notified that the minor camper has tested positive for COVID-19 or has been determined to be a close contact of an individual who tested positive for COVID-19.
- Campers who receive a positive test result or who are determined to be a close contact of an individual who tested positive while attending camp will be removed from camp and isolated until an authorized adult arrives to pick up the camper.
- All camp attendees and parents/guardians who are dropping off campers must (a) complete the Visitor Screening Survey no more than two (2) hours prior to arrival on campus; and (b) wear a mask/face covering upon arrival on campus.

Upon Arrival

- Campers will be tested for Covid-19 on campus and should receive results by 4 pm the same day.
 - o For campers under age 18, parents/guardians must sign applicable consent agreements for such testing or the camper will not be permitted to participate in the camp.
- If an individual receives a positive result from a COVID-19 test, the individual must isolate. User must contact the parent/guardian of the individual who tested positive to pick the child up, or to have an authorized adult pick the child up, within four (4) hours of notification. If the camp attendee is not from the local area, the camper who tested positive and parent/guardian or authorized adult may isolate in University Lofts apartments at no additional cost. The parent/guardian or authorized adult will be responsible for making arrangements for meals and for the cost of all meals.
- The cohort for the camp attendee with the positive test, any other camp attendees and/or User's employee who are determined to be close contacts must undergo COVID-19 PCR testing and must quarantine for the duration required by the applicable public health agency.
 - o If the close contact camp attendee is not from the Denver metropolitan area, the University may identify hotels available for quarantine at a discounted rate paid by attendee's authorized adult.
 - o The length of quarantine required depends on the instructions from the local public health agency. To avoid quarantine, the camper must provide documentation that shows they are fully vaccinated against COVID-19, which means producing a copy of their COVID-19 vaccine

card demonstrating that the individual is at least two (2) weeks after the final dose of a vaccine authorized by the U.S. Food & Drug Administration.

- All camp attendees must fully cooperate with contact tracing efforts.
